

Important Coastal wetlands for birds in Inhambane Province


- Save River delta

- Four coastal wetlands of importance for birds
- Reasonable quality of information for Bazaruto and Pomene, not so good for Inhambane and almost none for the delta

The wetlands of Inhambane Province are not very well known but contain most of these species




Breeding on the beaches and wetlands of Inhambane









One of 32 long distance migratory wetland birds which arrive in Inhambane Province in August and spend the northern winter here
